The Liberation of Crimea

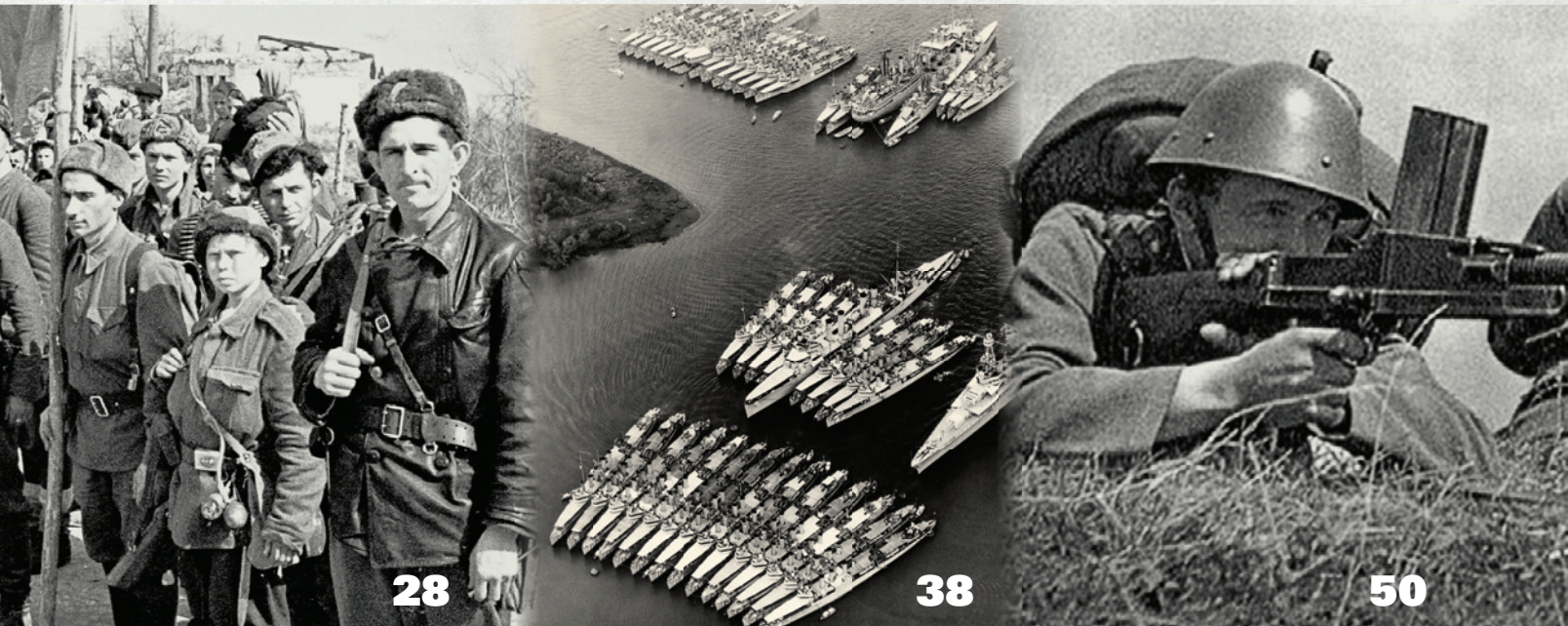
